- liquid needs, frozen services

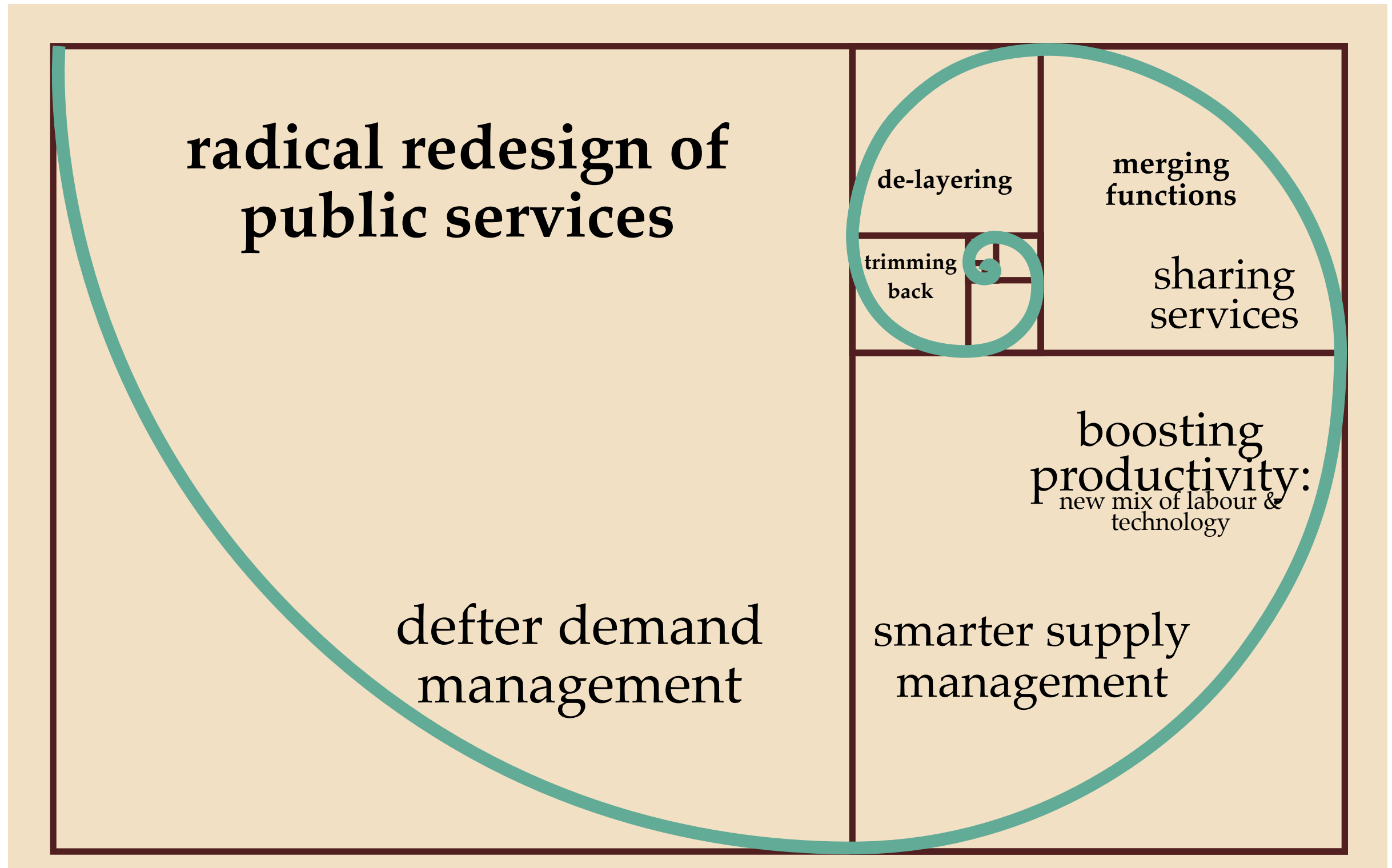
identity

- the era of social acceleration

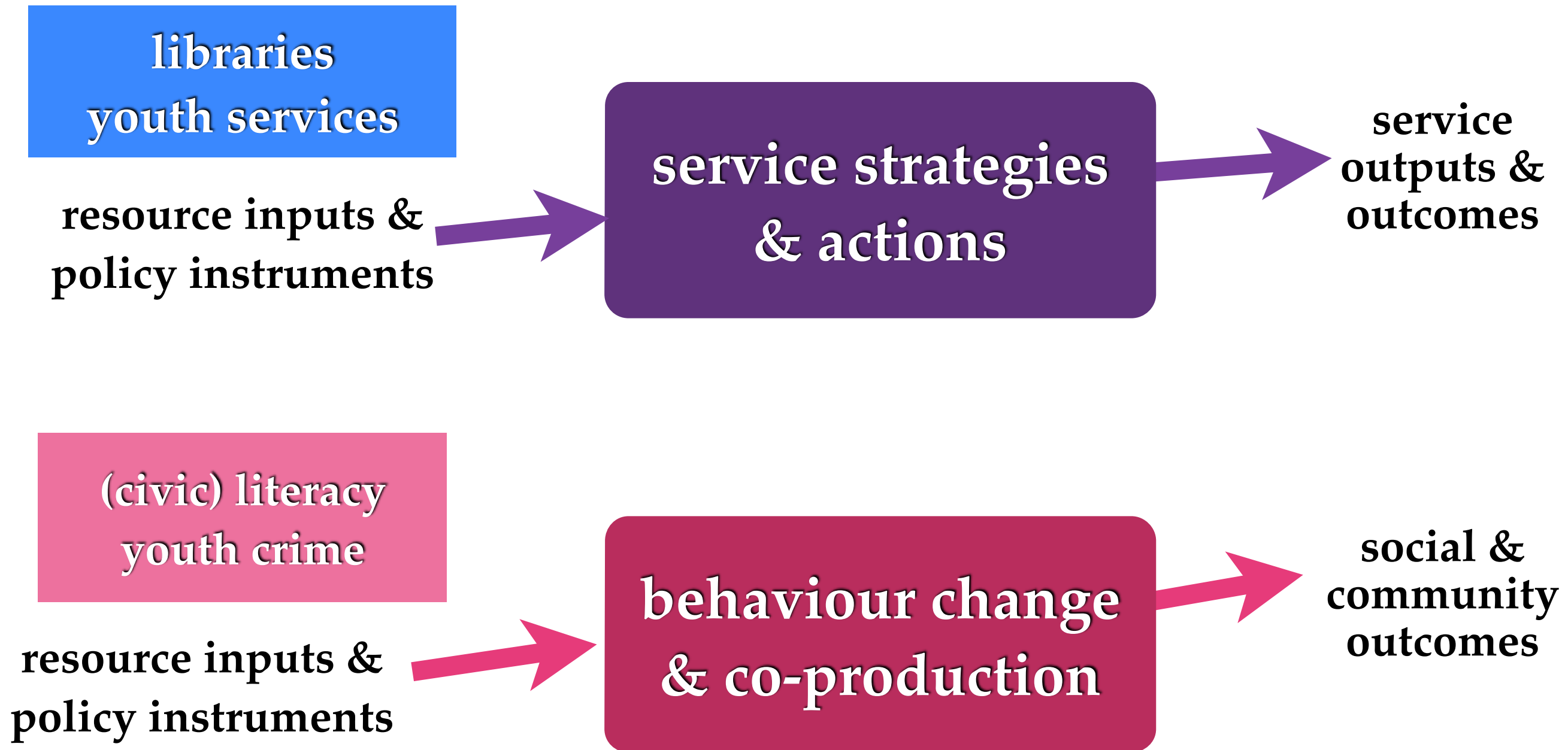
